Repealing farm laws!

M Narendra Modi, the other day surprisingly enough, announced the repeal of three controversial farm laws after a year of protests.

Farm unions are seeing this as a huge victory. But experts say that it might have been good for the democracy but certainly not the country – specially the farming community itself.

Many even say that the upcoming state elections in Punjab and Uttar Pradesh - both states having a huge base of farmers - may have forced the decision.

In his nationally-televised address, Modi said the farm laws were meant to strengthen the small farmers. "But despite several attempts to explain the benefits to the farmers, we have failed".

The PM also announced the formulation of a new committee -comprising officials from the Centre and states besides farmers and agricultural experts - to promote Zero Budget Natural Farming, encourage a scientific shift in the crop pattern, make minimum support price more beneficial for farmers, and make future decisions for the benefit of farmers.

The three Bills passed by the Parliament in September 2020 were: Farmers' Produce Trade and Commerce (Promotion and Facilitation) Bill, 2020; Farmers (Empowerment and Protection) Agreement on Price Assurance and Farm Services Bill, 2020; and Essential Commodities (Amendment) Bill 2020.

One of the biggest changes was that farmers were allowed to sell their produce at a market price directly to private players - agricultural businesses, supermarket chains and online grocers. Presently most of them sell the majority of their produce at government-controlled wholesale markets or mandis at assured minimum support price (MSP).

The laws also allowed private buyers to hoard food like rice, wheat and pulses for future sales, which only government-authorised agents could do earlier. The protesters said that this will allow the entry of private players in farming which will hurt their income since the rules - around sale, pricing and storage of farm produce - that have protected India's farmers from the free market for decades – were loosened.

But Modi and his ministers persistently insisted that the laws were good for farmers and there was no question of taking them back as it was time to make farming profitable even for small farmers and the new laws were going to achieve that.

The announcement has stunned political observers as well as those who both support and oppose the laws - many tweeted saying it was a huge victory for the farmers and a "major climbdown" for Modi government.

But some farm leaders and economists who saw merit in the laws have expressed disappointment over their repeal. BJP members said the decision to repeal the laws had nothing to do with the polls and the decision was taken to end the protest.

Farmers in Punjab and Haryana are celebrating the news, raising flags of victory and distributing sweets. But they say the fight is not over.



Who will be new Chairman of SEBI?

ho will succeed Ajay Tyagi as Chairman of SEBI in February. This question has arisen following an advertisement for the post being issued.

Three names that are doing rounds in the corridors of power in this context are — Anil Mukim — former Chief Secretary of Gujarat, Dr Debasish Panda - Secretary, Department for Financial Services and Madhabi Puri Buch - Whole Time Member.

However, given the past of the present NDA government, nothing can be said with certainty. Last time also post of SEBI Chairman was advertised but, interview did not take place and Chairman Ajay Tyagi was given extension till 2022.

It is also being asked in the corridors of power that will history be repeated again. Tyagi may again be re-appointed till he attains the age of 65. Tyagi, a 1984 batch IAS officer of the Himachal Pradesh cadre, was appointed as SEBI Chairman on March 1, 2017 for a period of three years. Subsequently, he was given a six-month extension and later in August 2020 his tenure was extended by 18 months.



Anil Mukim

Former Gujarat Chief Secretary Dr Anil Mukim, is a 1985 batch Gujarat cadre IAS officer who has earned kudos on various occasions. He pioneered Vadodara District Model adjudged as the Best E-governance project by Computer Society of India. Also, he was adjudged the Best Collector of the Gujarat as the Collector of Bhavnagar and as Vadodara Collector. Mukim has also served in the CMO when Narendra Modi was Gujarat Chief Minister.



Debasish Panda

Debasish Panda is a UP cadre 1987 batch IAS officer who has worked as Additional Secretary and Special Secretary, Department of Financial Services, Ministry of Finance from March 2018 to February 2020. Having undergone foreign training in Public Administration from USA & Philippines, has also been the Resident Commissioner of UP in Delhi and Chief Executive Officer, Greater Noida Development Authority.



Madhabi Puri Buch

Madhabi Puri Buch, whole-time member (WTM) at the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi), is the only female board member at SEBI. She oversees portfolios such as surveillance, collective investment schemes and investment management. An alumna of Indian Institute of Management (IIM), Ahmedabad, Buch has nearly three decades of financial market experience. She joined ICICI Bank in 1989.

Who will be next Chairman of ISRO?



With the tenure of the present Chairman of ISRO, K Sivan, coming to an end on January 14, 2021, the guessing game has started as to who will succeed him.

Dr. Sivan is currently Secretary (Space) and ex-officio chairman of Indian Space Research Organisation and Space Commission. He has previously served as the Director of the Vikram Sarabhai Space Center and the Liquid Propulsion Systems Centre.

Conferred Doctor of Science (Honoris Causa) from Sathyabama University, Chennai in April 2014, Dr. Sivan, who joined ISRO in 1982 and was inducted into PSLV Project, is specialised in Aerospace engineering, Space Transportation Systems Engineering, Launch vehicle and mission design, control & guidance design and mission simulation software design, Mission synthesis, simulation, analysis and validation of flight systems.

Appointed as the chief of ISRO in January 2018, ISRO under his chairmanship launched Chandrayaan 2, the second mission to the moon on July 22, 2019, Vikram rover crashed; the orbiter was not affected and is still orbiting the moon. However, on December 30, 2019 his chairmanship was extended by a year upto January 2022. His earlier tenure was up to January 2021



Though it is widely believed that Sivan will again get an extension in January 2022, incase this does not happens, S. Somanath, an Indian aerospace engineer and rocket technologist who is seniormost person in the Organisation and associated with ISRO, since 1985, is considered in the race for the top post.

Somanath is the Director of Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre (VSSC), the lead centre of ISRO responsible for design and realization of launch

vehicles. He has also been the Director of the Liquid Propulsion Systems Centre (LPSC), the lead centre of ISRO responsible for the design and realization of liquid propulsion systems for launch vehicle and spacecraft programs. But insiders also rule out his possibility of his taking over the reigns of the ISRO.

The space research activities were initiated in our country during the early 1960's, when applications using satellites were in experimental stages even in the United States.

It was with the live transmission of Tokyo Olympic Games across the Pacific by the American Satellite 'Syncom-3' demonstrating the power of communication satellites that Dr. Vikram Sarabhai, the founding father of Indian space programme, quickly recognized the benefits of space technologies for India. He was convinced and envisioned that the resources in space have the potential to address the real problems of man and society.

As Director, Physical Research Laboratory (PRL) located in Ahmedabad, Dr. Sarabhai convened an army of able and brilliant scientists, anthropologists, communicators and social scientists from all corners of the country to spearhead the Indian space programme which since inception has been orchestrated well.

Who will be the new CMD of PTC India?





With the CMD of PTC India Ltd., Deepak Amitabh resigning from the post w.e.f. November 5, 2021 due to personal reasons, process for selecting a new Chief of the Corporation is said to have begun. Grapevine has it that a Search Committee to select new CMD of the PTC Ltd is being formed. The Committee will interact with key people in the finance ministry and other stakeholders before sending the shortlisted names to the finance minister.

Though it is still not certain whether the new CMD will be former IAS or an expert in the power sector, names of certain persons have already started doing the rounds.

While Director (Marketing & Business Development) PTC, **Dr. Rajib K Mishra**, who has been given the additional charge of the top post w.e.f. Nov 6, 2021, is said to be a strong contender for the post of CMD PTC, name of **Pawan Singh**, Managing Director and CEO of PTC India Financial Services and former

IAS officer Rakesh Kacker is also in circulation for the coveted post, Kacker is presently Independent Director of the PTC.



Dr. Rajib K Mishra

Dr. Rajib K Mishra, who joined PTC Board iin February 2015 as Director (Marketing and Business Development) has worked as Executive Director PTC and was responsible for Operations, Business Development, Retail & Advisory Services. He played a key role in

starting of PTC retail business to meet power requirements of business entity. He has professional experience of 30 years with Powergrid, NTPC and PTC India. Before joining PTC, he was General Manager (CMG) with POWERGRID. He has also served NTPC and POWERGRID in various capacities.

With the three year tenure of Chief Economic Advisor (CEA) Krishnamurthy Subramaniam coming to an end on December 6 and his announcement that he would like to return to the academic field, search for his successor has started.

The GoI is learnt to be in the process of setting up a search cum selection committee for the new Chief Economic Advisor. Last time Dr Bimal Jalan was the Chairman of the Selection Committee. This time he may not be because of his age.

Sources say, this time 1964 batch former IAS officer N K Singh is likely to head the search cum selection committee for new Chief Economic Advisor. Applications will be invited and some who don't apply will be invited to do so.

The process to select a new CEO will be run for good optics but most likely Sanjeev Sanyal may be elevated from PEA to CEA. He is said to be a key contender because he is in tune with the Government and they would not want to again bring in somebody who does not get along with them.





- Purchase and/or fitment of any assistive device(s)/customization/retrofitting or conversion of available machine, equipment, vehicle to disabled friendly mode
